4. Annual Reports by the County Council, District Council, Parish Council.

Apologies received from Cllr Schwier. Annual Report on the Parish Council website.

Councillor Richard van Dulken presented the Annual Report for Braintree District Council, Key points:

- Councillor Grants to community organisation. Recent grant awarded to the Sports Ground Management Committee to re-decorate the pavilion and towards the outdoor exercise equipment.
- Appointed as Cabinet leader for Waste, Recycling and St Scene
- Regeneration of Town Centre High Street nearing completion with facilities include health facility, apartments, shops and underground car parking and bus station.
- Horizon 120 business park progressing
- New Hedingham Medical Centre, hopefully ready in summer 2023.
- Levelling Up Agenda –Braintree rural areas identified future improvements plans.

A resident enquired about the MOJ outline proposals for a mega prison at Weathersfield Airbase. Cllr Dulken reported that BDC were still awaiting to hear back from the MOJ on the outline proposals. Main issues of concern are the environmental impacts i.e. traffic, road infrastructure and local amenities.

Councillor Philip Rawlinson presented the Annual Report for Great Yeldham, key points:

- Sports Ground: installation of 6 pieces of outdoor exercise equipment and a clamber stack climbing frame
- Burial Ground: installation of 10 car parking bays
- Installation of new Village Notice Board.
- Village Tidy Up day was organised, the hire of BDC Refuse Vehicle collected 2.720 tonnes of unwanted household items.

- Installation of another dog bag dispenser near the side entrance of St Andrews School.
- The refurbishment of the adopted BT kiosk located outside the Reading Room and special thanks to our volunteer Christine, who decorates the kiosk around the seasons
